**MINNESOTA OVARIAN CANCER ALLIANCE'S  
SHOOT-OUT BENEFIT GOLF TOURNAMENT  
IN MEMORY OF MOLLY CADE**

Minneapolis – This year, Minnesota Ovarian Cancer Alliance's (MOCA) Shoot-Out Benefit Golf Tournament honors the memory of Molly Cade, one of MOCA's founders who passed away in 2004. Held at Brackett's Crossing Country Club in Lakeville, there will be a gala event on Sunday, July 17 at 5:30pm and golf tournament on Monday, July 18 at 11:00 am.

"Molly was an avid golfer so this is a wonderful tribute to her," says Joe Cade, MOCA Board Member and husband of Molly.

The evening gala features a silent and live auction, sit-down dinner and raffle drawing with a first prize of \$1,000. The suggested attire is business casual. The golf tournament begins with a buffet lunch and 30-minute golf clinic with a PGA pro. Shotgun start at 1:00 pm, scramble format, hole-in-one \$5,000 and skins game.

Mike Patterson, whose company King Solutions has been a major sponsor of this event for the past four years says, "The Shoot-Out is a great opportunity to raise money for ovarian cancer research and have a good time."

"It is critical that we raise awareness of the disease," explains MOCA Executive Director Kathleen Gavin "because other than knowing the symptoms, there is no way to diagnose ovarian cancer in its early stages." Unlike the Pap smear, which screens for cervical cancer, and the Mammogram for breast cancer, there is no consistently reliable test available for ovarian cancer. This year alone, more than 22,000 women will be diagnosed with the disease and an estimated 16,000 women will die from it.

The funds generated from the gala and golf tournament will help MOCA achieve its mission of funding ovarian cancer research, raising awareness of the disease, and providing support to women with ovarian cancer and their families. In the past five years, MOCA has awarded more than \$1 million for ovarian cancer research in Minnesota.

The cost of the gala is only \$50; golf and buffet lunch \$150. Golfers who wish to attend both events may do so for \$150. The deadline to register is July 3.
